

## Total Apple Movement Exceeds Five-Year Average

Total movement of 15.4 million bushels in May 2006 was 3 percent less than in May 2005 but 16 percent more than the five-year average of 13.3 million bushels, according to the U.S. Apple Association's (USApple) June 1 survey of apple storage facilities.

### Fresh Apple Movement

May 2006 fresh apple movement of 10 million bushels was 7 percent less than during May 2005 but 15 percent more than the five-year average. Movement of fresh-market apples from controlled atmosphere (CA) storage was 4 percent lower than in May 2005, but 16 percent more than the five-year average.

Regionally, movement of fresh-market apples in the Northeast was 24 percent less than May 2005, and 14 percent lower than the five-year average. May 2006 movement in the Southeast was 8 percent less than

May 2005, and 50 percent lower than the five-year average.

May 2006 movement of fresh-market apples in the Midwest was 4 percent lower than May 2005, but 14 percent higher than the five-year average for the month. The Southwest showed no movement since no fresh apples remained in storage; however, 27,000 bushels moved last May. Movement of fresh-market apples from the Northwest was down 5 percent from May 2005, but 20 percent more than the five-year average for the month.

### June 1 Total U.S. Holdings

Total U.S. holdings of fresh and processing apples on June 1, 2006, were 27.3 million bushels, 20 percent less than holdings on June 1, 2005, and 3 percent less than the five-year average of 28.2 million bushels.

Holdings of fresh-market and

## Good Weather Offers Hope of Strong 2006 Crop

Weather conditions across apple growing areas of the country have included greater than average rainfall and hail in some areas. Early indications point towards a strong crop in most regions.

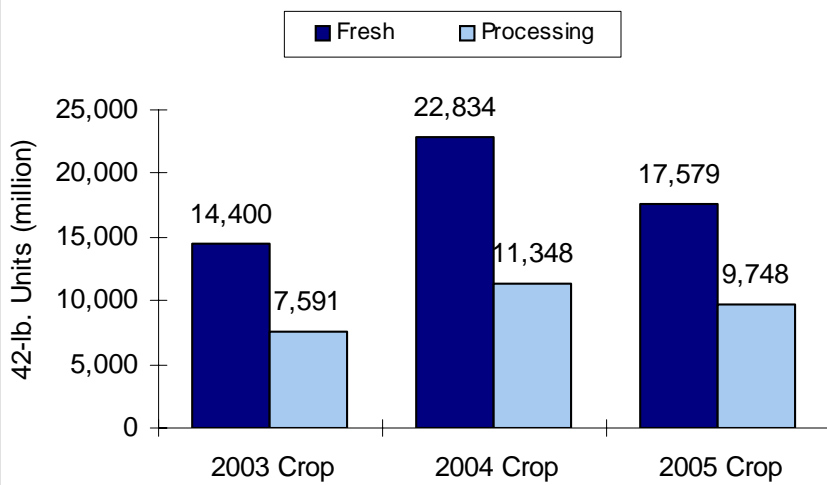
The apple growing areas of Washington received more rain than usual in late May bringing the total precipitation amount to two inches above average for the end of May. Washington escaped major frosts at the beginning of the growing season. The first round of thinning did not do as well as expected and growers were more aggressive during second thinning which was helped with higher than normal temperatures. The warm temperatures also sped crop development which is considered to be now just a week behind normal. Severe weather in late May caused some hail damage in some regions in Washington. These hail losses are yet undetermined, but will most likely reduce the top-end yield potential.

The California crop is two weeks behind normal due to cool temperatures earlier in the season. However, recent temperatures have been warm and growers are optimistic that weather has not affected the crop's potential, according to reports from the state.

Michigan experienced cool, cloudy weather conditions during thinning but recent warm temperatures have accelerated the development of the crop. Rains have helped soil moisture levels. Grow-

ers are optimistic about the size of the crop at this time.

The Appalachian region (Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia and West Virginia) experienced cooler than normal weather in early May, but recent warm weather has helped crop development. Growers estimate apple development to be about a week ahead of normal. Thinning was delayed slightly, and growers are now assessing the results. The crop in the Appalachian region is estimated to be average or above average in size at this time.

Certain areas of New York had excellent bloom and good weather for pollination this year. Wet weather during full bloom in the Champlain area resulted in poor pollination there. The whole state experienced warm weather in the latter part of May which has helped crop development.

All areas of New England experienced heavy rainfall during May with excessive rain and flooding in some areas. No hail has been reported and there were a few dry days for pollination. Apples are developing on a normal schedule and growers are still thinning in most areas of the region.

## Apple Movement Tops 5-Year Average

processing apples in CA storage on June 1, 2006, were 25.6 million bushels, a 20 percent decrease compared to June 1, 2005, and 6 percent less than the five-year average for that date.

Total processing apple holdings as of June 1, 2006, were 9.7 million bushels, a 14 percent decrease from June 1, 2005, but 5 percent more than the five-year average for processing holdings for that date.

### **Fresh Apple Holdings**

Total fresh-market apple holdings of 17.6 million bushels on June 1, 2006, were 23 percent less than at the same time last year, and 7 percent less than the five-year average.

On a regional basis, fresh holdings in the Northeast were 31 percent lower than holdings on June 1, 2005, and 20 percent lower than the five-year average for that date.

Southeast June 1, 2006, fresh holdings were 360 percent more than on June 1, 2005, and 17 percent more than the five-year average for that date.

In the Midwest, June 1, 2006, fresh holdings were down 76 percent as compared to holdings on June 1, 2005, and 80 percent less than the five-year average.

Fresh-market apple supplies were sold out in the Southwest on June 1, 2006, and also on June 1 last year. The five-year average for holdings in the region is 10,000 bushels.

Northwest June 1, 2006, fresh holdings were 21 percent less than on June 1, 2005, and 4 percent less

than the five-year average.

Fresh CA holdings as of June 1, 2006, were down 21 percent compared to June 1, 2005, and 7 percent less than the five-year average for holdings on that date.

### **Varietal Holdings**

On a varietal basis, June 1, 2006, fresh Red Delicious holdings were 8.4 million bushels, a 29 percent decrease from 2005, and 24 percent less than the five-year average.

Fresh Golden Delicious holdings of 3.4 million bushels decreased 17 percent from last year's holdings but were up 8 percent as compared to the five-year average.

June 1, 2006, fresh Granny Smith holdings of 2.5 million bushels increased 4 percent from 2005, and were 33 percent above the five-year average.

Fresh Fuji holdings of 1.4 million bushels on June 1, 2006, were down 44 percent as compared to last year's holdings on that date but were up 5 percent as compared to the five-year average.

Fresh Gala holdings on June 1, 2006, were 587,000 bushels, 314 percent more than June 1, 2005, levels, and 352 percent more than the five-year average.

Fresh Empire holdings were 98,000 bushels, 60 percent lower than 2005, and 67 percent less than the five-year average.

McIntosh holdings on June 1, 2006, were 54,000 bushels, down 81 percent from holdings on June 1, 2005, and down 69 percent from the five-year average.

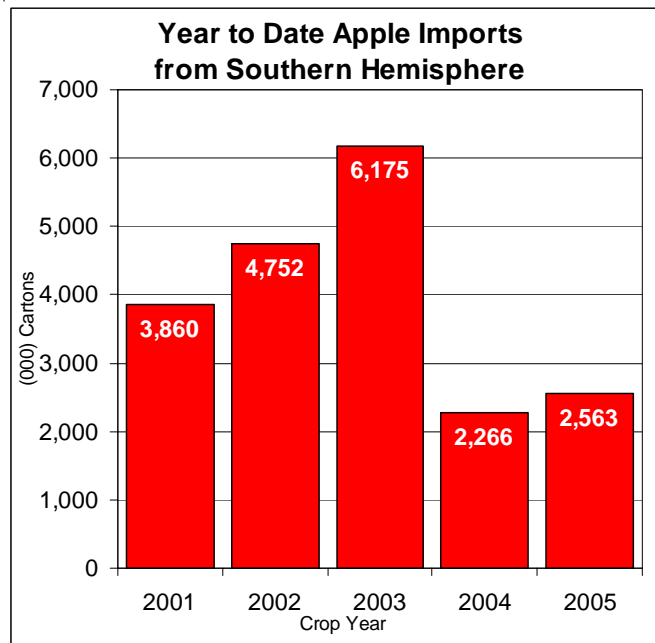
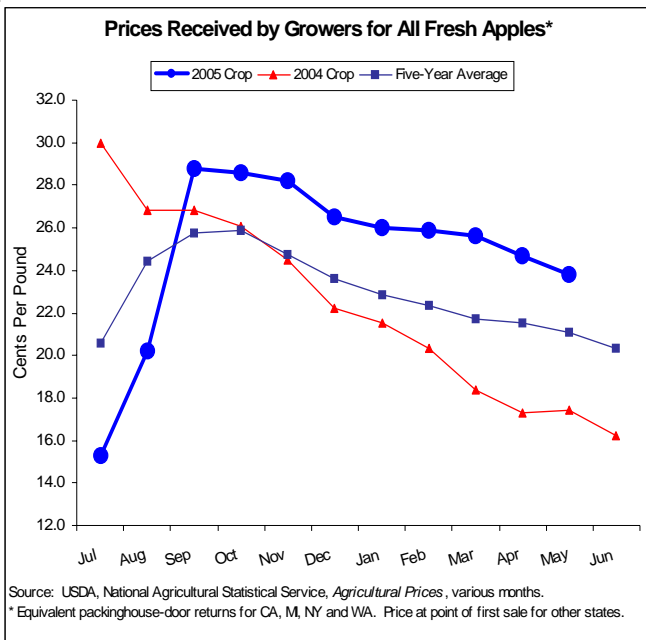
